

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

Summer Reading Program

It's never too early to bring your child to story time! Infant story time is geared toward babies from birth to 2 years old with plenty of nursery rhymes, songs, and boards books for young children.

Write & Illustrate Your Own Book Contest

As part of our Family Place Library initiative, children ages 1 - 3 and their parents/caregivers are invited to attend this play-focused workshop series with child development specialists on hand to answer questions about a number of topics including early literacy, nutrition, music and play, language, and more.

Enchanted Library

Toddler Story Time is geared toward children ages 2 – 3 ½ years old, those who are ready to move around and explore. We'll share stories, finger plays, songs, instruments and more with a focus on the early literacy skills and gross and fine motor skills. Your child will also have the chance to socialize with other children their own age.

Monthly Special Events

A program for preschoolers ages 3 ½ - 6 years old, this story time continues to use the early literacy skills as a basis for fun with more interaction for young children ready and willing to express themselves.
